

# WORLD HISTORY

"Remember the former things of old," the book of Isaiah says, "for I am God, and there is none else; I am God and there is none like me, declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure." (Isaiah 46:9-10).

## General Objectives

My main goal in this class is teaching students how to properly understand and interpret world history through a biblical lens. Times, dates, events, and historical figures are important to know, but without a proper biblical *understanding* they are just facts that hold little to no current value or application. By applying a thoroughly biblical worldview to world history, students will learn to identify and understand God's Providence throughout the pages of time. The Bible is the best source for understanding why people do what they do...to themselves, to each other, and with respect to their Creator.

## Homework

Students are expected to stay current on chapter reading (CRITICAL), Section Quizzes, and Student Activity assignments.

Homework should be completed with minimal parental input.

Student Activities available via Canvas & Section Reviews are in the textbook.

## Testing

There are twenty-four (chapter) tests in the BJU curriculum, but students will only be responsible for fifteen. All tests will be taken open-book and at home. I don't want my students bogged down in memorization—my goal is proper interpretation of history that leads to a deeper understanding of God, people, and the application of His Word.

## Grades

- Chapter Tests: 60% of the final grade
- Section Reviews & Student Activities: 20% of the final grade
- Person of Interest Papers (3): 20% of the final grade

**Note:** Person of Interest Papers need to be 2-3 pages in length, typed, 12-point font and double-spaced. I will suggest certain people as we move through the curriculum, but the choice is ultimately up to each student. The people should be DEAD...not current figures will be accepted.

These papers will require students to do some research outside of class materials (end notes required). Students should choose historical figures of personal interest and may go outside of the course materials in that choice. Papers need to focus on:

- *Brief* biographical info
- WHY did you choose this person?
- WHAT can you learn from them (positive or negative)?
- MOST interesting aspects of their life to YOU!

NOTE: One of the papers MUST be about a family member...at least a grandparent in age...not necessarily alive. I believe it is important for our students to know a bit about WHERE THEY CAME FROM! If they can interview a grandparent, that would be great!

### Extra-Credit

There will be multiple opportunities to earn extra-credit and those will be announced in class. Points earned will be added to the overall test grades and can have a significant impact on your overall grade.
